



Foundation Stage Newsletter – Issue 3

This week we have been looking at the children's physical development and our focus question has been, 'What can we do with our bodies?' We have assessed the children's ball skills, including throwing, catching and kicking a large ball, looked at their ability to hold a pencil, ride 2 and 3 wheel bikes and scooters and use scissors effectively. During carpet times we shared the book 'Funny Bones' and learnt a new song about our bodies.

We have taught the children that they need to independently put on their own shoes and socks, coats and jumpers and we ask that they practise these skills at home. The children now know our raffle ticket reward system. Perhaps ask your child how this system works.

CAUGHT YOU DOING THE RIGHT THING – RAFFLE TICKETS

As part of our behaviour management strategy in school we strive to reward positive behaviour. This is achieved by setting goals, based on following the Golden Rules, for the week and rewarding the children as we notice them making good choices. They receive raffle tickets when they are "caught doing the right thing". These raffle tickets are put in a pot and a name is drawn out each week and that child receives a small prize for their good school conduct.

This is in addition to our **Star Pupil Certificate** which is awarded each week to a child who has an exceptional week. This can be for a personal goal achieved which shows star quality or a generally high standard of achievement during the week.

LEARNING CHALLENGE CURRICULUM

The curriculum at East Hunsbury Primary School which all children across the school follow is an enquiry based approach to teaching and learning. The Learning Challenge concept is built around the principle of greater learner involvement in their work. It requires deeper thinking and encourages learners to work using a question as a starting point.
