Flat-heeled black shoes that are polishable (not trainers or fashion shoe e.g. vans, Nike, canvas etc.) Sensible, plain black ankle boots are also allowed. Socks - grey, white, black or navy with checked skirt/pinafore. Tights – grey/bottle green or navy with checked skirt/pinafore	Plain black socks
Jewellery: a pair of small gold or silver studs / sensible, non-electronic watch which doesn't connect to the internet.	Plain black sweatshirt ( <u>non logo</u> ) or black and white top with school logo or green E.H.P.S logo sweatshirt/cardigan or plain bottle green sweatshirt/cardigan
Plain hair bands, clips and bobbles are allowed in school colours (bottle green, yellow or black). <i>Children are not permitted to wear brightly coloured or fashion hair accessories.</i>	Jewellery: all jewellery must be removed prior to the school day.
Coats: The school encourages children to spend as much time outdoors as possible, even in inclement weather conditions. Therefore, coats that are suitable to the weather conditions are required. There are no restrictions as to type of coat worn, however it is strongly advised that they are waterproof in nature.	

Please note that we are phasing out our yellow t-shirts and PE trainers should be plain black or white.

In Maths, we created our own McDonalds and had to use money to buy our food. We took it in turns to order as well as being the employee in McDonalds, making sure we gave the correct change!

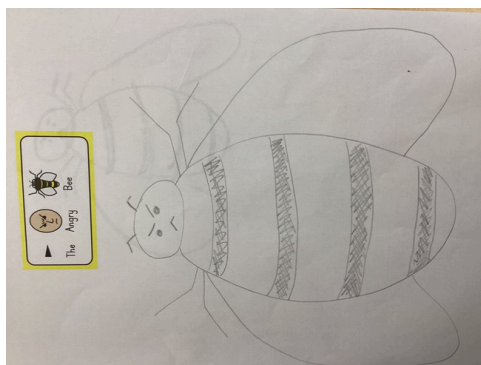
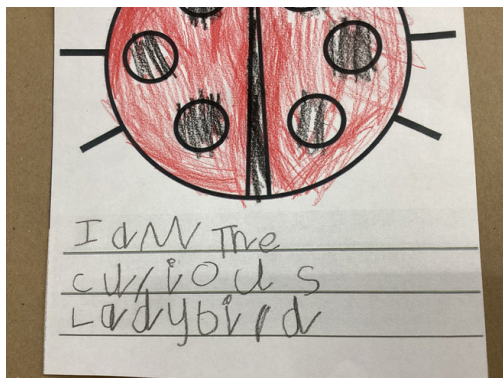

We are now all very tired and looking forward to the summer holidays, but we are excited for our last few days in Yellow Class as well as our Sports Day

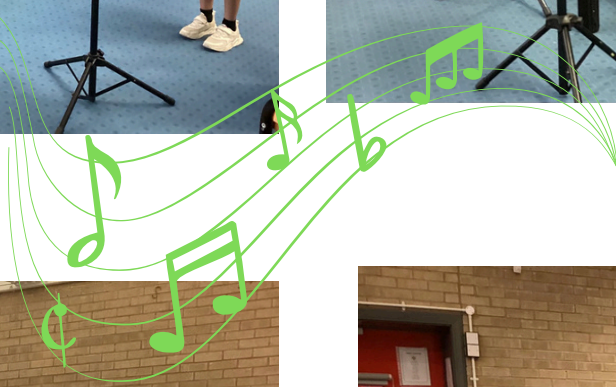

# EHPS NEWSLETTER JULY 2024

## PARENT SURVEY RESULTS

A huge thank you everyone who took the time to complete the parent survey. Reading your feedback is really enlightening and once again the overall feedback was extremely positive - even better than last year which is very encouraging!

Here are the results:

We had **171** responses (which is 29 more than last time and 154 more than the year before!)

- **97%** agreed or strongly agreed that their child is happy at EHPS with 58% strongly agreeing!
- **97%** agreed or strongly agreed that their child feels safe at EHPS.
- **94%** agreed or strongly agreed that the school makes sure that the pupils are well behaved.
- **70%** said that their child had not been bullied. Of those that said their child had been bullied, 51% agreed or strongly agreed that the school dealt with it quickly and effectively - 37% were neutral.
- **99%** agreed or strongly agreed that the school makes them aware of what their children are learning during the year.
- **97%** agreed or strongly agreed that when they raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly with 42% said that they haven't raised any concerns
- **98%** agreed or strongly agreed that the school gives their child with SEND the support they need to succeed.
- **96%** agreed or strongly agreed that the school has high expectations for their child.
- **97%** agreed or strongly agreed that their child does well at this school.
- **98%** agreed or strongly agreed that the school lets them know how their child is doing.
- **97%** agreed or strongly agreed that the school's curriculum is good.
- **91%** said that their child can take part in clubs.
- **90%** agreed or strongly agreed that the school supports their child's wider personal development (with 7% unsure).

**And... 98% of people who replied said that they would recommend this school to another parent! AMAZING.**

**And we received countless positive messages and kind words about our staff and what we do - thank you everyone, I will ensure that they receive them.**

Parental controls can help to protect your child from seeing something that they shouldn't – although it is important to emphasise that no system is effective all of the time, so it is important to engage with your child and talk to them about their online life regularly.

### What Parents & Educators Need to Know about ONLINE TROLLING

The term "trolling" refers to sending hurtful or provocative comments – often done anonymously online – to provoke a reaction or cause emotional distress. Anonymity can embolden people into saying things they wouldn't dare say in person. Euro 2024 and other tournaments tend to put an emphasis on this, with the abuse of both players and fans often increasing during such events.

**WHAT ARE THE RISKS?**

- ESCALATION**  
Many trolls begin with silly, banal comments before moving on to a broader pattern of offensive messages and posts. They can also turn their attention very quickly to a new target if they grow bored with an existing one, which means engaging with one abuser at least – and potentially thousands of others.
- HIDING BEHIND A SCREEN**  
Because trolls tend to use anonymous profiles, they enjoy a lack of accountability. This also means they often have multiple profiles, potentially switching between them regularly or printing out addresses several of them at the same time, making it hard to track them or block them. After all, once you block one account, what's to stop them re-registering elsewhere?
- 24/7 CONTACT**  
The internet has given us the ability to remain in contact at any time, from almost anywhere in the world. A troll having the ability to reach you whenever they want can leave you feeling like your closure is impossible. While they don't see you in real life, they can message you at any time, reach out to your peers online and even try to discover your personal information to scare you.
- HATE SPEECH**  
Sadly, many trolls resort to spreading racial abuse, homophobic abuse and other forms of hate speech. These often stand the best chance of causing emotional harm. This can add a heavy degree of weight to their attacks, moving from what might otherwise be described as "teasing" into genuine hate crime. After Euro 2020, three England footballers were racially abused, resulting in several prison sentences.
- IMPACT ON VICTIMS**  
It's not uncommon for the victims of trolls to shut down their accounts, disappear from public life, and try to stay out of the crosshairs for a time – with some even leaving social media forever. This can have a severe impact on children and young people's connections to friends and the world at large, and may not even actually stop the troll. The victims' families, for example, may have online profiles that trolls can still access.
- NORMALISATION OF TROLLING**  
It is, regrettably, inevitable that some people will go too far in their criticisms or comments, both online and in the real world. This can lead to many people seeing trolls and their abuse as part and parcel of social media – an inherent risk of interacting with others online. It doesn't mean, however, that it should be considered "normal" or even tolerated.

### Advice for Parents & Educators

- USE PARENTAL CONTROLS**  
While social media platforms (where most trolling tends to happen) aren't always helpful when responding to abusive behaviour, parents can set up account settings to use content filters on certain apps or certain times. There's always the potential for trolling to occur anyway – such as friends sharing screenshots to one another – but this would minimise the likelihood of children seeing it.
- DON'T ENGAGE WITH ABUSE**  
A well-known adage on social media is "don't feed the trolls". Fundamentally, if a child identifies a potential troll online, it's best not to engage with them directly. Instead, consider setting up a log to gather evidence for reporting them later on, including screenshots and quotes where possible.
- ENCOURAGE EMPATHY**  
While every professional athlete aspires to maintain high standards, it's important to separate the player from the person. A player's performance doesn't make them worthy of abuse, and that can often be forgotten by younger children who simply see the colour of the shirt without considering the person wearing it. For all the rivalry between teams, it's essential children understand that players are still human beings, with families and lives outside of sport.
- BLOCK AND REPORT**  
While anonymous accounts make it difficult to block trolls permanently – or even for very long – it's still good practice to help children learn to control who can engage with them online. It's not worth "feeding the trolls", and it's more helpful to block them, report them, and try to move on. Blocking and reporting is an anonymous process, too, so there'll be no indication of who specifically saw the website.
