MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear Families

That's the end of our first full week back and it has been an amazing week!

On Monday, we welcomed our new children into reception and we are amazed with how brilliantly they have settled in. We hope that our families feel supported on this important journey and we are looking forward to seeing them grow and learn throughout the year.

Last week, we had an assembly every day. On Wednesday's assembly we learnt about 'Finding our Greatness' and launched our Proud Points.

On Thursday, we talked about why we come to school, how our behaviour in school is really important and read the book Bottled. It is a



book we have read before but I wanted to share it as it teaching us all about not bottling up their emotions.



Then, on Friday we explored the phrase: 'Yes I can!' Inspired by this video from the Rio Paralympics and read the book: The Girl Who Figured it Out, which is the inspirational true story of Minda Dentler,

a paralyzed orphan from India who went on to be the first female wheelchair athlete to complete in the Ironman World Championships. This week, our assembly was focussed on the Leadership Roles we have in school and how to apply for them. We want to grow our future leaders and know that pupil voice is a huge part in shaping the direction and success of East Hunsbury. Our Leadership roles this year are:

- Reading Ambassadors (Years 2-6)
- School Ministers (Years 1-6)
- Maths Ambassadors (KS2)
- Kindness Ambassadors (Years 2-6)
- Playleaders (KS2)





REGISTRATION TIME - MAINSTREAM

The register is taken at 08:45am – all children must be in school by this time, ready to learn (not arriving). This means that their coats and bags need to be away and they are in their classroom ready. School gates open at 08:30am.

Children arriving after 8.45am will be marked as 'late' in the register and this will affect their overall attendance marks.

Children arriving after 9.15am will be marked as 'unauthorised absence,' this will also affect their overall attendance marks.

REGISTRATION TIME - SU

The school day timings are **8.40am - 3.30pm** for ALL children in the SU. This means Blue Class children will start and finish at the same time as all other SU classes. Classroom doors will open at **8.40am** and we will take the register at **8.55am** daily. **This means if your child arrives after 8.55am they will be marked as late.**

What is your job?

My name is Miss Lucy Jenkinson and I am in my fifth year of teaching. I currently teach Year Four. I have previously taught Year Four, Five and Year Six twice.

What does it feel like to be a new teacher at a school?

Being a new teacher can be really quite daunting! Getting to know the school site and where everything is can take some getting used to and I think new pupils must share this too. There are lots of staff members

to get to know and learning everyone's names on top of all the children's takes a while. I think there are many similarities to starting as a new teacher and as a pupil; getting used to the new school site, new people to meet and get to know, new timetables to get your head around and getting to know how the school generally works.

What do you do to prepare yourself for teaching in a new school?

Like children starting a new school, we get a couple of days at our new school to meet staff, meet our new class and have a tour of the site. This is helpful to gather as much information as possible about timetables, staff members I need to know about and what my new class will be like. I usually go in over the summer to set my classroom up and start meeting staff and getting to know the caretaker: someone you should have on your side!

Did you always want to be a teacher?

Originally, I wanted to be a TV presenter or a journalist as I am interested in media, but helping teach ballet at my dance school inspired me to become a teacher. I had some fantastic teachers at primary and remembered how much fun I had and I knew from this that I also wanted to create and share these experiences for children.

Do you have a favourite subject you like teaching most?

I love teaching literacy. I enjoy reading and love literature and getting children excited about books and writing.

What qualities do you need to have to do your job well?

You need to be a people person. Engaging children in their learning at all different levels and learning styles requires you to be able to understand people and interact and engage with them on their individual level. You need to be organised – the list of jobs is endless and it's important to try to keep on top of them. You need to have a good sense of humour and have patience and understanding for the children, staff and adults that you work with.
